Thank you for your cooperation during our arrival and dismissal times. First days are always a bit challenging as students learn their way around the building. Remember, beginning tomorrow we will begin with our new safety procedures for arrival and dismissal. That means you will say goodbye to your child as you drop them off outside. All Kindergarten through 3rd grade students will be waiting by the cafeteria doors until 7:57, while 4th and 5th graders will wait behind the chain link fence. To help speed the drop-off, have backpacks and lunch boxes ready and pull as far forward as possible.

Two reminders: Walkers are dismissed *after* the busses are gone at 3:08 PM. Also, the bus loop is only for staff and busses. Since students will be using the doors on the cafeteria side, use the front loop and the cafeteria side parking lot if you need to park.
