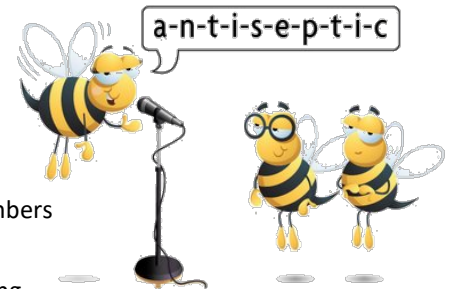

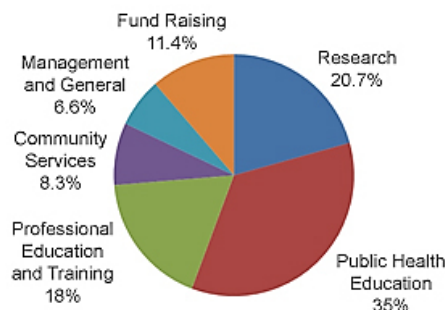


Jump Rope for Heart American Heart Association
