**Eligibility Requirements:**

1. Individuals 18 years of age or younger with Medicaid, insurance that does not cover vaccines, no insurance coverage, or of American Indian/Alaskan Native descent. A \$12 per injection administration fee is requested; vaccine will not be denied due to inability to pay.
2. We do bill some insurance companies. **Parents should call to verify that we take their insurance.**
